TWENTY YEARS A PRIEST

It's hard to believe that I was ordained 20 years ago on Tuesday August 22. I recall so very clearly entering St Charles Seminary in late January 1998. It seemed such a different life, but the exhilaration of study and prayer was a great companion through those 'hidden years'. My first appointment was as Assistant Priest in St Thomas More, Bateman. Having completed two years in that position I was sent to Sacred Heart, Goomalling as Parish Priest. During this time, I had to cover 7 Wheatbelt towns: Goomalling, Wyalkatchem, Dowerin, Bolgart, Wongan Hills, Ballidu and Dalwallinu. You could say that I learned a lot about ministry in the Wheatbelt. After only 18 months I was again moved to St Anthony's Wanneroo, which unbeknown to me would become my home for 11 years. Having entered my 6th year on Mundaring...I am still excited about being a priest and look forward to the many surprises the Lord has in store for me.

FOOTSTEPS OF MARY MACKILLOP



I was fortunate to have 10 days following the footsteps of St Mary of the Cross. The days offered varying insights into her journey to becoming Australia's first Saint. From the opening gathering at St Francis Church in Melbourne to the final steps at St Mary's Precinct in Adelaide, each day we encountered more about Mary and a better understanding of

encountered more about Mary and a better understanding of her life.

Key reflections for all who were on the Pilgrimage were Mary's words: "Remember we are all but travelers here" and "Never see a need without doing something about it." Both of these inspirational quotes we saw numerous times as we heard more of the story of St Mary.

As we journeyed from Melbourne through to Adelaide the sites and places visited

provided information of each significant event in the life of Mary MacKillop. To visit the places where she began her first school, where she was excommunicated or secretly attended mass provided the context for the times in which Mary lived. To be in Penola, which is probably the most significant place for her, on her Feast Day was extra special.



Visiting the Providence House and seeing the door through which Mary and her sisters fed those who were less fortunate provided a depth of knowledge and a greater appreciation that cannot be found in a book.

These insights provided a great deal of information of the hurdles that she faced and how she overcame them. All through her journey Mary had one focus and her faith in God

which enabled her to deal with each of the hurdles encountered. As a result of her dedication the order she established, The Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, were instrumental in educating the children of Australia.

The Order established many schools in the most regional parts of WA, providing education to the indigenous and marginalized children in society.

The Scholastic Book Fair starts Thursday 7 September!


Come along and browse the great range of books and perhaps purchase an early Christmas present.
